

- NORTH: Beverly Blvd., Hollywood (101) Fwy.
- SOUTH: Florence Ave.
- EAST: Broadway Blvd.

When one of the two hospitals has requested diversion due to ED Saturation, patients shall be transported to the hospital that has not requested diversion.

When both CAL and GSH have requested diversion due to ED Saturation, patients will be transported as follows:

- A. 9-1-1 patients north of Olympic Blvd. will be transported to GSH.
- B. 9-1-1 patients south of Olympic Blvd. will be transported to CAL.

Pediatric patients who do not meet guidelines for transport to a PTC/PMC, as defined in Ref. No. 510, Pediatric Patient Destination, will be transported to CAL, which has an Emergency Department Approval for Pediatrics (EDAP).

Patients exhibiting neurological deficits (except those patients with obvious neurotrauma as defined in the Prehospital Care Policy Ref. No 506, Trauma Triage) will be transported to CAL.
