

Additional items for re-stock should be maintained and secured in the vehicle or in the Medical Unit Trailer.

NOTE: Providers should stock sufficient quantities of medical supplies and medications, especially controlled substances, to avoid mid-incident restock. Incident medical units may not be capable of re-supplying controlled substances. Controlled substances should be secured as per LA County Prehospital Care Policy Ref. No. 702 and the FEMP provider's standard operating procedures.

The FEMP should report to the incident with the full complement of EMS supplies ready to work. The incident will re-supply the FEMP to the best of its ability.
